May 25th: PROPOSES ADDITIONAL ACTION ON STATE GUN LAWS IN WAKE OF DEADLY MASS SHOOTING AT TEXAS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The [comprehensive plan](#) included the issuing of two key Executive Orders. The first [Executive Order 18](#) will establish a new unit within the Office of Counterterrorism dedicated solely to the prevention of domestic terrorism, while also establishing a dedicated State Police unit to track domestic violent extremism through social media. The second [Executive Order 19](#) will require State Police to file for an Extreme Risk Protection Order (ERPO) under New York State's Red Flag Law whenever they have probable cause to believe that an individual is a threat to themselves or others. Governor Hochul delivered remarks at a meeting of the Interstate Task Force on Illegal Guns.

June 1st: The NYSDOH Cooling Center Finder is now active and available from the Cooling Center Home page: <https://www.health.ny.gov/environmental/weather/cooling/index.htm>

In the Map view - Users can enter a New York State address and find a location of Names, Address, Contact Number and Days and Hours of Operation of cooling centers within 15 miles of that location. Users can also obtain driving, walking directions or information on public transportation to a cooling center from an address. As a reminder, for addresses in New York City, users will be directed to the NYC Cooling Center Finder.

In the List view - Users can use the dropdown menu to find information on Names, Address, Contact Number and Days and Hours of Operation of cooling centers reported for each county.

The BRFSS is an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by the NYSDOH.

Updated Messaging: COVID-19 Vaccination for Children 6 Months + Older

June 20, 2022: The CDC recommends that children age 6 months and older should get a Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. The decision was made after analyzing substantial data from clinical trials involving thousands of children, confirming the vaccine's safety and effectiveness for children in this age group. The CDC also advises that children age 5 and older who receive the Pfizer vaccine should get a booster at least 5 months after their second shot.

PHCC has created a one-page chart reflecting the latest vaccine recommendations for children, as well as sample social media posts and graphics to help you answer questions about children and vaccines across age groups in your community.
