July 11th: GOVERNOR HOCHUL ANNOUNCES THE LAUNCH OF A NEW COVID-19 TREATMENT HOTLINE BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN PARTNERSHIP WITH NYC HEALTH + HOSPITALS

- **888-TREAT-NY Hotline Utilizes NYC Health + Hospitals' Virtual ExpressCare Platform**
 - **Proven Treatment Options Available to Effectively Treat COVID-19**
 - **Statewide Hotline Will Help Reduce Barriers to COVID-19 Treatment for all Communities**

All New Yorkers outside of New York City, regardless of income or health insurance coverage who test COVID-19 positive, are eligible to be evaluated for treatment by calling 888-TREAT-NY (888-873-2869) or completing an evaluation at the [NYS COVID-19 ExpressCare Therapeutics Access](#) website, which includes a telemedicine visit. The Hotline is available 24-hours per day, seven days a week and operated by experienced Health + Hospitals professionals who have the clinical training to prescribe treatment and referrals if needed. The ExpressCare platform is a service that allows New Yorkers to receive virtual care from a NYC Health + Hospitals provider. New York City residents should call 212-COVID-19.

The telemedicine visit will include a clinical assessment by medical providers who will identify the appropriate COVID-19 treatment plan, which may include a prescription for Paxlovid or Molnupiravir. These [oral antiviral](#) medications have both been proven to decrease hospitalization for those that are at risk for severe disease. When given soon after positive COVID-19 diagnosis these antivirals also help fight infection and shorten recovery time. As all treatments require a prescription, those who test COVID-19 positive should talk to their provider or call 888-TREAT-NY to determine what treatment is best for them. New York State is assigned a weekly allotment of both [Paxlovid](#) and [Molnupiravir](#) from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services.

Under the agreement, insured patients will pay a co-pay amount based on their plan and the New York State Department of Health will cover the costs of the service for those without health care coverage. Learn more about COVID-19 treatment options at [health.ny.gov/CovidTreatment](#)

June 27th: All NYS mass vaccination sites are open to eligible New Yorkers aged 5 and older. Walk-in vaccination available at all sites on a first-come, first-serve basis for people aged 12 and older. Information on which sites require appointments for children in the 5-11 age group is available on [our website](#). People who prefer to make an appointment at a state-run mass vaccination site can do so on the [Am I Eligible App](#) or by calling 1-833-NYS-4-VAX. People may also contact their local health department, pharmacy, doctor or hospital to schedule appointments where vaccines are available, or visit [vaccines.gov](#) to find information on vaccine appointments near them.

New Yorkers looking to schedule vaccine appointments for 5-11-year-old children are encouraged to contact their child's pediatrician, family physician, county health departments, Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), rural health centers, or pharmacies that may be administering the vaccine for this age group. Parents and guardians can visit [vaccines.gov](#), text their ZIP code to 438829, or call 1-800-232-0233 to find nearby locations. Make sure that the provider offers the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, as the other COVID-19 vaccines are not yet authorized for this age group.

June 29th: NEW GUN SEIZURE AND CRIME DATA SHOWING PROGRESS IN COMBATING GUN VIOLENCE EPIDEMIC

New data on gun seizures, gun-tracing investigations, and gun-related crime that indicates New York State's exhaustive efforts and strategic investments to combat the gun violence epidemic are beginning to show signs of progress. The data includes a substantial year-over-year increase in seizures—both coinciding with the formation of the Interstate Task Force on Illegal Guns.

June 16th: RELEASE OF STATEWIDE ADDRESS-LEVEL BROADBAND MAP

July 7th: DOH UPDATES NEW YORKERS ON MONKEYPOX RESPONSE STRATEGY

•NYSDOH ISSUES ELIGIBILITY FOR INITIAL JYNNEOS VACCINE DISTRIBUTION, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CDC GUIDANCE

The New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) today updated New Yorkers on its strategic response to the current monkeypox outbreak. In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance, NYSDOH released vaccine eligibility for the initial doses of the JYNNEOS vaccine from the federal government, prioritizing communities with the highest level of need. As vaccine supply remains limited, the Department urges New Yorkers to monitor the Department's [website](#) for the latest information about this outbreak.

July 1: NEW! Webinar recording now available: NYS Provider Webinar titled “[UPDATED COVID vaccine clinical guidance for vaccinating individuals 6 months-11 years old](#)”

June 23rd: COVID-19 VACCINES AND GUIDANCE AVAILABLE FOR CHILDREN DOWN TO 6 MONTHS OF AGE

In accordance with FDA authorization and CDC recommendations, eligibility for the two vaccines available for children down to 6 months of age is as follows:

Children 6 months – 4 years of age are eligible for three shots of the **Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine**. The initial two doses are administered three weeks apart, followed by a third dose administered at

least eight weeks after the second dose. The two-dose Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine has already been authorized and available for children 5 years and older.

Children 6 months – 5 years of age are eligible for two shots of the **Moderna vaccine**, given one month apart. The vaccine had been authorized for use in adults 18 years of age and older.

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NYSDOH ANNOUNCEMENTS: COOLING CENTERS

June 1st: The NYSDOH Cooling Center Finder is now active and available from the Cooling Center Home page: <https://www.health.ny.gov/environmental/weather/cooling/index.htm>

In the Map view - Users can enter a New York State address and find a location of Names, Address, Contact Number and Days and Hours of Operation of cooling centers within 15 miles of that location. Users can also obtain driving, walking directions or information on public transportation to a cooling center from an address. As a reminder, for addresses in New York City, users will be directed to the NYC Cooling Center Finder.

In the List view - Users can use the dropdown menu to find information on Names, Address, Contact Number and Days and Hours of Operation of cooling centers reported for each county.

NYSDOH ANNOUNCEMENTS: BRFSS Reports

New reports based on 2020 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and nation.

July 11th: NYSDOH BRFSS report “[**Cardiovascular Disease, New York State Adults, 2020**](#)”, provides updated prevalence estimates of NYS adults who reported having had a heart attack, angina/Coronary Heart Disease (CHD), or stroke in the state.

- An estimated 1,118,000 adults (7.3%) in NYS reported they have had a heart attack, angina/CHD, or stroke.
- The proportion of adults reporting a heart attack, angina/CHD or stroke increases for each decade of life and is significantly higher for those aged 65 and older compared to those younger than 65.

- Men, adults with less than a college education, and adults who experience food insecurity are more likely to report a heart attack, angina/CHD or stroke than women, adults with a college education, and adults with food security.
- Stroke prevalence is higher among non-Hispanic black adults (4.0%) than among non-Hispanic white (2.4%), Hispanic (2.0%) or other race, non-Hispanic adults (1.9%).
- The prevalence of cardiovascular disease among adults living with disability (17.7%) is over four times greater than the prevalence reported among adults living without disability (4.4%).
- The prevalence of heart attack or angina/CHD and stroke are significantly higher among adults diagnosed with diabetes or high blood pressure compared to adults without diabetes and more prevalent among adults with obesity compared to those without overweight or obesity.

Updated Messaging: COVID-19 Vaccination for Children 6 Months + Older

July 7: New Messaging: Monkeypox

- There is a vaccine for monkeypox.
- Monkeypox can be treated with available antiviral medicines.
- While COVID-19 passed easily from person to person, monkeypox does not spread as easily between people. Monkeypox transmission typically requires skin-to-skin contact, direct contact with body fluids, or prolonged face-to-face contact.

In light of the increase in monkeypox cases, we've updated our [Answers to Tough Questions](#) with new messaging to help you answer questions like "What is monkeypox?" and "How does monkeypox spread?" PHCC will continue to monitor developments on monkeypox.

ICYMI: New Messaging on the Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine

June 30: The Novavax vaccine (NVX-CoV2373) is a two-dose, protein-based COVID-19 vaccine for adults age 18 and older. With emergency authorization from the European Union and the World Health Organization, the Novavax vaccine is being used in over 40 countries; however, it is not currently available in the United States. On June 7, 2022, the FDA advisory committee voted to recommend emergency use authorization, and the vaccine is currently under review by the FDA. Pending FDA and CDC recommendations, Novavax may soon become the fourth COVID-19 vaccine available in the U.S., in addition to Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson.

PHCC released their [Answers to Tough Questions](#) on the Novavax vaccine in advance of the FDA and CDC's pending recommendations. You can use our updated Novavax vaccine messaging to help answer questions in your community, including "What is the Novavax Vaccine?" "How does Novavax differ from other available vaccines in the United States?" and "What are the known side effects of the Novavax vaccine?" PHCC will continue to monitor developments on COVID-19 vaccine approval and will update our messaging on the Novavax vaccine to reflect changes in CDC guidance.
