11/10/2022: GOVERNOR HOCHUL UPDATES NEW YORKERS ON STATE'S PROGRESS COMBATING COVID-19

Governor Encourages New Yorkers to Keep Using the Tools to Protect Against and Treat COVID-19: Vaccines, Boosters, Testing, and Treatment

24 Statewide Deaths Reported on November 9

Governor Kathy Hochul today updated New Yorkers on the state's progress combatting COVID-19 and plan to protect against the spread of viral respiratory infections that become more common in the fall and winter seasons.

Last week, Governor Hochul launched a new public awareness campaign featuring New York State Health Commissioner Dr. Mary T. Bassett speaking directly to New Yorkers about three viruses - Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), flu and COVID-19 - now circulating in the state with similar symptoms and the potential to cause serious illness. Produced by the New York State Department of

Health, the videos include a [short clip](#) and a [longer version](#) geared toward parents; and a version aimed specifically at [health care providers](#).

Governor Hochul continues to remind New Yorkers that children ages 5 and older may now receive the [bivalent booster shots](#) that are recommended to increase protection against COVID-19.

The Governor also urges New Yorkers to get their bivalent COVID-19 vaccine boosters. To schedule an appointment for a booster, New Yorkers should contact their local pharmacy, county health department, or healthcare provider; visit [vaccines.gov](#); text their ZIP code to 438829, or call 1-800-232-0233 to find nearby locations.

In addition, Governor Hochul encourages New Yorkers to get their annual flu vaccine as [flu season is widespread](#) across New York State. The flu virus and the virus that causes COVID-19 are both circulating, so getting vaccinated against both is the best way to stay healthy and to avoid added stress to the health care system.

The State Department of Health is continuing its [annual public education campaign](#), reminding adults and parents to get both flu and COVID-19 shots for themselves and children 6 months and older. Advertisements in both English and Spanish language began running last month.

The [COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker Dashboard](#) is available to update New Yorkers on the distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine. The New York State Department of Health requires vaccinating facilities to report all COVID-19 vaccine administration data within 24 hours; the vaccine administration data on the dashboard is updated daily to reflect the most up-to-date metrics in the state's vaccination effort. New York State Department of Health-reported data from NYSIIS and CIR differs slightly from federally reported data, which is inclusive of federally administered doses and other minor differences. Both numbers are included in the release above.

New Yorkers looking to schedule vaccine appointments for 5-11-year-old children are encouraged to contact their child's pediatrician, family physician, county health departments, Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), rural health centers, or pharmacies that may be administering the vaccine for this age group. Parents and guardians can visit [vaccines.gov](#), text their ZIP code to 438829, or call 1-800-232-0233 to find nearby locations. Make sure that the provider offers the Pfizer-BioNTechCOVID-19 vaccine, as the other COVID-19 vaccines are not yet authorized for this age group.

November 7th: GOVERNOR HOCHUL SIGNS EXECUTIVE ORDER TO CREATE NEW YORK'S FIRST-EVER MASTER PLAN FOR AGING

On Older New Yorkers' Day, [Executive Order](#) Calls for Comprehensive Master Plan for Aging to Ensure Older New Yorkers Can Live Healthy, Fulfilling Lives While Aging with Dignity and Independence

**Department of Health and Office for the Aging to Head a Master Plan for Aging Council;
Convene a Stakeholder Advisory Committee**

Governor Kathy Hochul today signed an executive order to create the state's first-ever Master Plan for Aging to ensure older New Yorkers can live healthy, fulfilling lives while aging with dignity and independence. Signed on Older New Yorkers' Day, the Executive Order directs the Commissioner of the State Department of Health and the Director of the State Office for the Aging to head a Master Plan for Aging Council, which will then gather input from relevant stakeholders to draft guidance for building healthy, livable communities that offer opportunities for older adults.

"As the first age-friendly state in the nation, we continue to take important steps to empower and support older New Yorkers," **Governor Hochul said**. "This Master Plan for Aging will provide us with tools to ensure our aging New Yorkers have access to quality long term care in healthy, livable communities where they can thrive."

Governor Hochul's executive order is the first step toward building a comprehensive roadmap for meeting the socioeconomic needs of all generations of New Yorkers as they age. Building on New York State's status as the first state in the nation to officially receive AARP's age-friendly designation, the Master Plan for Aging will help to coordinate existing and new state policy and programs for older adults and their families, while also addressing challenges related to communication, coordination, caregiving, long-term care financing, and innovative care models with the overarching aim of furthering the ability for more to age with dignity and independence.

The executive order was signed in advance of the New York State Office for the Aging annual [Older New Yorkers' Day](#) celebration, which honors volunteerism among older adults statewide. Starting at 1 p.m. today, this year's [virtual celebration](#) will honor 94 older adults across the state for their unique contributions through civic organizations, charities, in schools or libraries, on behalf of health and human services organizations or other non-profits, and through acts of kindness.

Health Commissioner Dr. Mary Bassett or her designee will chair the Master Plan for Aging Council, Office for the Aging Director Greg Olsen will serve as vice-chair, and relevant state agency commissioners and directors will serve as its membership. The council will then assemble a stakeholder committee, including members from health care and support service providers; consumers; informal caregivers; older adults - particularly those in communities experiencing disparities; health plan companies, labor and community-based organizations, employers, experts on aging, and academic researchers, among others.

Earlier this year, the State Department of Health established the Office of Aging and Long-Term Care to develop policies and programs to meet the needs of older New Yorkers and people with disabilities who require long-term care services and support. Created in July, this new office is working closely with the Office of Health Insurance Programs, the Office of Primary Care and Health Systems Management, and the state Office for the Aging to coordinate Department of Health activities related to aging New Yorkers.

November 10th: New York State Department of Health Honors Veterans Day with Commitment to Ensuring Health Equity for All Veterans

New Report Finds Disabilities and Some Chronic Health Conditions More Common Among Veterans Than Non-Veterans

ALBANY, N.Y. (November 10, 2022) – In honor of Veteran's Day, the New York State Department of Health is reinforcing its commitment to ensuring its programs are aimed at eliminating health disparities that result in adverse health outcomes for all New Yorkers, with a focus on the health of the State's military personnel before, during, and after their service.

"Social and economic imbalances can have a devastating impact on the health and overall wellbeing of all New Yorkers but especially among veterans who may experience additional health issues related to their military service," **State Health Commissioner Dr. Mary T. Bassett said.** "The State is committed to ensuring our programs eliminate health inequities and address the needs of veterans so they can achieve optimal health."

An annual survey, [the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System \(BRFSS\)](#), conducted by the Department found an estimated 969,000 adults, or 6 percent of the adult population, are veterans, and that 13.5 percent of adults in New York aged 65 and older report past military service.

The report found disabilities are common among veterans, with 37 percent of veterans report at least one disability, compared to 26 percent of non-veterans. Of all adults who report serious difficulty hearing, 18 percent, or more than 1 in 6, are veterans.

Veterans aged 18 to 64 are more likely to report they engage in behaviors that put their health at risk, including smoking, and are more likely to report diagnoses of other health conditions, including cardiovascular disease (CVD), chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), obesity, high blood pressure, diabetes and arthritis than non-veterans in the same age group.

Veterans aged 65 and older are more likely to report a diagnosis of cancer or CVD compared to non-veterans in the same age group.

The State remains committed to monitoring veterans' health and health care utilization as part of ongoing chronic disease prevention and control efforts, using data collected in the [annual report](#) to estimate the size, demographics and health characteristics of the veteran population in New York, enabling the Department to focus on eliminating health disparities and ensuring every veteran attains their full health potential.

NYSDOH ANNOUNCEMENTS: BRFSS Reports (October 2022)

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors,

and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and nation.

There are early signs that this upcoming flu season in the U.S. could be severe, according to recent [CDC data](#). Flu hospitalizations are on the rise, and they are higher than usual at this time in the season. Flu is one of several respiratory illnesses circulating, including RSV and COVID-19.

V-safe for COVID-19 — Reminder! V-safe, CDC's after vaccination health checker, is available for enrollment after any dose of COVID-19 vaccine, including updated bivalent boosters. It takes just a few minutes to enroll and enter vaccine information and then v-safe will send participants personalized and confidential health check-ins via text messages to ask how they feel after vaccination. Participation in v-safe helps CDC gather important information and monitor any potential side effects in real time so scientists can quickly study them and determine if there is a safety concern with a particular vaccine. This information helps us communicate timely and transparent information about the safety of vaccines to public health officials, healthcare providers, and the public.
