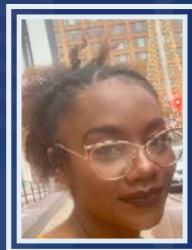

Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (JEDI) is a core principle of NYSPPHC, with the Fellowship Program addressing health equity in three ways: People (recruitment), Pedagogy (education and training), and Projects (Fellowship projects and placements).

Providing Public Health Workforce Development Opportunities to Advance Health Equity

Introduction
The New York State Public Health Corps (NYSPPHC) is expanding public health capacity to support COVID-19 vaccination operations and increase preparedness for future public health emergencies across the State. The NYS Department of Health (NYSDOH) is working with community partners to identify and train up to 1,500 Fellows to participate in the NYSPPHC Fellowship Program. Local Health Departments and NYSDOH are the primary sites for the Fellows to provide critical support to core deliverables and assist in response to public health emergencies. [Learn More](#)

Health equity is achieved when every person has the opportunity to attain his or her full health potential and no one is disadvantaged from achieving this potential because of racial/ethnic or other socially determined differences.

NYSPPHC addresses Health Equity in three ways:

- 1. People - Recruiting a diverse applicant pool and encouraging just, equitable living practices of Fellows by LHD and NYSDOH employers.
- 2. Pedagogy - Provide ongoing training on the public health core competency of Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (JEDI) through:
 - 1. Monthly educational series
 - 2. Local Public Health Essentials certificate program
 - 3. NYSPPHC Summits
 - 4. Regional conference meetings
- 3. Projects - The NYSPPHC Fellowship Program is advancing health equity through direct program services and by preparing Fellows to integrate health equity principles throughout their work as they move through their career.

Methodology
The sample Projects below were selected out of approximately 200 total Fellowship placements to highlight diversity, equity and inclusion work in Local Health Departments across New York State.

Erie County
The Public Health Graduate Fellow's main responsibilities are to coordinate with Buffalo Freedom Gardens to assist BPOC communities in Buffalo and Niagara Falls to provide tools, education, and resources necessary to create gardens in their own backyards. The Fellow also acts on questions aimed at addressing food insecurity in communities of color. The purpose of the Fellowship position is to increase food security and resilience in urban communities identified as being food deserts, as well as an encouraging local community members to participate in the farming industry.

Suffolk County
The Public Health Fellow's main responsibilities are to assist the Office of Minority Health staff with COVID-19 outreach and education, in developing relationships with health-care communities of color and providing public health education for constituents. By providing programming in multiple languages, the fellow promotes diverse equity, and inclusion in the community.

Warren County
The Mental Health Open Access Fellow's main responsibilities are to provide health education services to vulnerable individuals who are struggling with addiction and/or a mental health problem, assist individuals in obtaining resources to service providers, and providing Narcan/Naloxone Opioid Overdose trainings to the community. The purpose of the fellowship position is to provide services that have been disrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic, especially to marginalized and vulnerable populations struggling with mental illness and substance use.

Conclusions

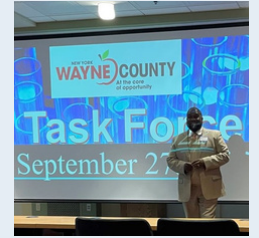
- Local Health Departments are best situated to determine their Fellowship projects to best address health inequities and labor projects as such.

Fellow Spotlight!

The Wayne County Opioid Task Force reconvened for the first time since 2019 on Tuesday, September 27, 2022. Bernadin Valcin, Public Health Corps Fellow from Wayne County Behavioral Health, presented information gathered by key stakeholders regarding the status of opioid overdoses in Wayne County over the past several years. Subcommittees on Prevention, Data, Treatment, Law Enforcement, and Health Disparities are currently being formed to focus on specific areas of need to identify barriers and to ensure that individuals experiencing a substance use disorder receive the most comprehensive care they need.

Bernadin is currently providing free Narcan Trainings through Wayne County Behavioral Health to individuals and agencies, based on request. If you are interested in scheduling a training or would like any additional information, please contact Bernadin at BValcin@co.wayne.ny.us

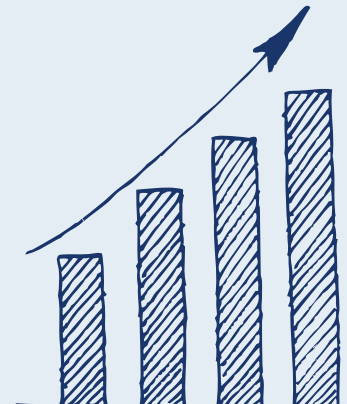

“ Hello! My name is Brian Meyers. I am the Director of Fire and Emergency Management (WY-51) and a Supervisor for the NYSPHC Fellowship Program. The Fellow position, working in conjunction with the Health Department, is assisting with the development of a county Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system, as well as quality improvement, grant applications, and citizen preparedness outreach.



The Wyoming County Office of Emergency Services (OES) is responsible for the overall planning and response coordination for emergencies in the county. The OES will ensure the county is prepared to respond to and recover from all natural and man-made emergencies for our citizens, employers, and visitors. This is accomplished by:

- Administration and presentation of fire and EMS training programs to countywide emergency services personnel
- Comprehensive all hazards pre-disaster planning
- Pre-disaster mitigation planning
- Pre-disaster recovery information and assistance to the general public

Additionally, the OES coordinates trainings for fire and EMS through the New York State Department of Homeland Security and the Emergency Services Office of Fire Prevention and Control, as well as the New York State Department of Health Bureau of Emergency Medical Services.

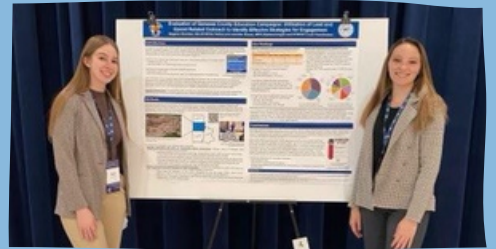
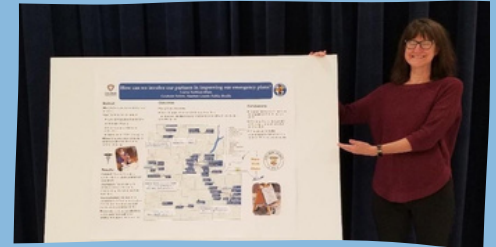

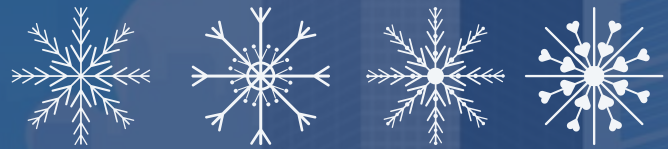
