

Alzheimer's & Brain Awareness Month June 2023

At what age should we worry about our brain's health? Our 50s? 60s? 70s? Or younger? Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia. Most cases of Alzheimer's disease are diagnosed at age 65 or older, but 10% of new cases of Alzheimer's disease are of people under 65, according to <u>Harvard Medical School</u>. Although early onset is fairly uncommon, it is possible. Extreme cases of early-onset Alzheimer's can occur in your 30s.

There are several major causes of Alzheimer's in people 65 years or younger, other than a family history. Poor sleep, illegal drug use, medication side effects, alcohol use, depression, and anxiety are some lifestyle concerns that can negatively affect your brain health.

There are different activities you can do to help improve your memory to help combat dementia:

- Getting quality sleep
- A healthy diet (e.g., nuts, fruits, vegetables, fish, olive oil, avocados, etc.)
- Physical activity, such as exercising daily
- Quality social time
- Stay mentally active (e.g., reading, puzzles, crossword puzzles, brain exercises, etc.)
- Stay on top of your health, especially if there are any chronic illnesses to manage

"Serving as a NYS Graduate Public Health Fellow has been an honor! I graduated from St. Bonaventure University with an M.Ed. and a NYS School Administration certification. As an area educator for over 30 years, as a classroom teacher, school administrator, and lecturer at St. Bonaventure, I have been dedicated to supporting children by finding ways to meet their needs inside and outside the classroom. In 2020, I co-founded Operation Warm Hearts (OWH), a 501c3 charitable foundation based in Olean, NY, to serve children needing clothing, coats, and boots. My fellowship has allowed me to develop collaborations with various Cattaraugus County Health Department programs and divisions to ensure their services reach those who need them most while visiting OWH. These collaborations have included work with the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program, the Healthy Neighborhoods Program, the Children and Youth with Special Healthcare Needs program, and the Public Health and Education and Planning Division. OWH has now become a hub for families to connect with health and social services outside the clinical setting. We now can offer a comprehensive network of support to families and children in our community."


