Vaccinations have saved lives. As early as the 15th century, people tried to inoculate communities against smallpox by intentionally exposing healthy individuals to the virus. It wasn't until 1796 that Dr. Edward Jenner created the first successful smallpox vaccine. He used matter from a cowpox sore to vaccinate a young boy from smallpox.

We are many years advanced from the first smallpox vaccine and how it was initially prepared and administered. There are 15 vaccines, plus the COVID-19 vaccine, recommended by the CDC. Throughout modern medical history, we have learned vaccines are safe, effective and have saved millions of lives globally.

On December 12-13, 2023, the New York State Public Health Corps (NYSPHC) Fellowship Program will host its second annual Fellowship Summit in Albany, NY.

The Fellowship Summit will be guided by an overarching theme and a supporting tagline:



#### Theme: Building Partnerships that Strengthen Public Health Tagline: Systems, Infrastructure, Capacity, and Equity

The event will include staple activities such as keynote speeches, presentations, poster sessions, panels, and workshop sessions.

We will incorporate a NYSPHC Fellow's Video Project into the Summit again this year. It is our hope that the NYSPHC Fellow's video project will continue to provide a creative opportunity for Fellows to share what they are working on with the State and Local Health Departments. The videos will help to visually highlight individual Fellows, the State and Local Health Departments, and agencies that they are working with, that paint the picture of the future of New York's public health workforce.

#### Video Submission Guidelines:

• Using a smartphone or other recording device, capture a video (90 seconds or less) of yourself or group responding to one of the following questions listed below. You can also submit pictures and audio clips, if desired. We encourage creativity. Please feel free to respond with a standard verbal response or use dance, music, poetry or other medium to give your video a creative spin!

- 1. How have you addressed public health response during your Fellowship about ensuring that access, equity, and sustainability continues moving forward beyond 2023?
- 2. What innovative contributions have you made during your Fellowship to address the needs that arise in transitioning New York to a post-pandemic future?
- 3. What excites you about your Fellowship? How does it support building partnerships that strengthen Public Health?

#### \*Please click the following link to access simple tips for creating videos: Video Tutorial

- Shoot the video in landscape format (horizontal, not vertical).
- Shoot the video in a quiet space with ample lighting (direct light should be in front of you, not coming from behind). Speak clearly in a command voice. Ensure the phone volume is set at the highest level.
- Use either standard or Bluetooth headphones when recording for optimal audio outcomes.

• Provide your response in 90 seconds or less. Videos longer than 90 seconds may need editing as determined by the video review committee. The committee reserves the right to edit any videos.

• Please ensure that your video file does not exceed 100 MB.

• Please indicate the one question represented by your video and provide a word-by-word written transcript, preferably in Microsoft Word, double spaced, and 12-point font size. If editing is required, the transcript will help to ensure the main points of your video submission will be shared.

• Complete the release form that will allow the NYSDOH to use your video; this release is embedded in Cadmium.


