Speaker Bio

Kevin is the Executive Director of the Healthy Capital District, a not-for-profit collaboration of providers and public health institutions in the capital region. The Healthy Capital District is the preeminent source for public health data in the region; assists over 10,000 people annually access public health insurance or navigate obstacles to care; provides preventive oral health services to over 4,000 children annually at schools in low-income neighborhoods; as well as providing training for certifying peers and the community health workforce. Kevin serves on the boards of the Hudson Mohawk Area Health Education Committee and the Jim Nichols Foundation. He is also a member of the New York State Ad Hoc Committee to Lead the Prevention Agenda and is a past board member of the New York State Public Health Association, the Center for the Elimination of Minority Health Disparities, and the New York State Oral Health Coalition.
