## NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the

District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and nation.

#### **COCA NOW Antifungal-resistant Ringworm Infections**

August 25, 2023 - Ringworm, also called tinea or dermatophytosis, is a common fungal infection of the hair, skin, or nails caused by dermatophyte fungi. Ringworm spreads easily by skin-to-skin contact with infected animals or people and by fomites (everyday objects or surfaces that may be contaminated). Usually, ringworm skin infections are minor ailments that can be treated successfully with topical antifungal medications or oral terbinafine, a first-line oral antifungal drug for ringworm, in cases of widespread infection.

However, ringworm caused by *Trichophyton indotineae*, a frequently antifungal-resistant fungus, can cause widespread, highly inflamed lesions on the face, trunks, arms, legs, or groin. *Trichophyton indotineae* infections generally do not improve when treated with most topical antifungals or terbinafine. Antifungal-resistant ringworm is difficult to treat and can affect anyone, including people with healthy immune systems. Outbreaks of antifungal-resistant ringworm are occurring in the Indian Subcontinent, and cases have been detected throughout Asia and Europe.

Dermatologists and public health officials in New York City have [reported](#) cases of severe ringworm caused by *Trichophyton indotineae* and [fungal nail infections](#) resistant to terbinafine. In July 2023, an [analysis](#) from a reference laboratory testing dermatophyte isolates from several U.S. states and Canada found that 19% of the



isolates were resistant to terbinafine. A study from [France](#) described severe ringworm cases potentially transmitted during sex among men who have sex with men. To date, there have been no similar published reports of ringworm transmitted through sexual contact in the United States. Additional data are needed to understand the extent of severe and antifungal-resistant ringworm in the United States.

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## Multi-Dose Vial Safety Reminders for National Immunization Awareness Month

Each August marks National Immunization Awareness month, an annual CDC-supported observance that highlights the importance of routine vaccinations for people of all ages. During this observance, healthcare workers play a critical role in both advocating for and safely administering vaccines to their patients. Project Firstline wants to ensure that all healthcare workers who give vaccines understand and practice injection safety and use multi-dose vaccine vials correctly each time.

Multi-dose vaccine vials require a specific set of safety procedures that should be used every time a vaccine is prepared and given. 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## September is Sepsis Awareness Month: Learn How You Can Protect Yourself and Your Loved Ones from Sepsis

Anyone can get an infection, and **almost any infection, including COVID-19**, can lead to sepsis. Sepsis is the body's extreme response to an infection and is a life-threatening medical emergency. If you or your loved one has an infection that's not getting better or is getting worse, ACT FAST. Get medical care IMMEDIATELY. Most cases of sepsis start before a patient goes to the hospital. Most people who develop sepsis have at least one underlying medical condition, such as chronic lung disease or a weakened immune system. Nearly a quarter to a third of people with sepsis had a healthcare visit in the week before they were hospitalized.

September is Sepsis Awareness Month and CDC encourages patients and healthcare professionals to get ready by sharing *Get Ahead of Sepsis* resources and to learn how to protect themselves, their loved ones, and their patients from sepsis.

### **ICYMI: August 3, 2023 - New Messaging: CDC Recommendation on Pediatric RSV Antibody Treatment**

On August 3rd, [the CDC announced the recommended use of nirsevimab \(Beyfortus\)](#). Beyfortus is a new Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) monoclonal antibody treatment for infants and young children at risk of severe illness caused by RSV infection. Beyfortus has been shown to reduce the risk of both hospitalizations and healthcare visits for RSV in infants by about 80% and is expected to be available this fall—when RSV season begins.

### How to Describe an Innovation Process

[Public health innovation](#) is a strategy that supports transformation and modernization, leading to ways of doing things differently than ever before. Health departments must innovate to meet emerging needs and develop solutions with community members. Health departments can foster a culture of innovation by:

- Providing training and education on innovation processes.
- Being open to new ideas, perspectives, and ways of doing things (and supporting staff in trying new things without a fear of failure).
- Including diverse voices and perspectives and ensuring community voice is centered.
- Encouraging staff time to be used to brainstorm and contribute to innovation processes.

As part of the [PHAB Standards and Measures for Reaccreditation](#), health departments must provide an example of how they foster innovation – not an example of an innovative program. To help prepare health departments to demonstrate this measure, health departments in the second or third Annual Report Cycle may choose from a menu of Reflection and Learning options to submit a

narrative or example, such as a project, that demonstrates efforts to foster innovative skills. PHAB has put together tips, resources, and Learning Center trainings to help guide you through the requirements Measure 9.2.2 A.

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## **Trust for America's Health (TFAH)**

- TFAH recently published the article [Navigating Climate-Related Threats to the Public's Health](#). The article highlights the significant climate challenges the US has faced in 2023, identifies actions taken by the Biden-Harris Administration in response to these threats, and underscores how preparing for weather-related events is a critical element of public health emergency preparedness.
- Children's Environmental Health Network has published the blog post [Keeping Children Safe During Extreme Heat Events: Tips](#). The article highlights signs of heat illness and heat exhaustion in children and how to reduce health risks before and after extreme heat events.
- Big Cities Health Coalition has published the new messaging guide entitled [Public Health: Changing the Narrative](#). Between March and May 2023, the Big Cities Health Coalition polled key audiences in its [member jurisdictions \(35 big cities\)](#) with the goal of better understanding how individuals who are skeptical of public health interventions could be moved to better support the important role governmental public health departments and leaders play in their communities. The new resource includes top-level findings and messaging recommendations.
- New data from the [University of Michigan National Poll on Healthy Aging](#) shows that half (52%) of people between the ages of 60 and 80 said they were aware of the new respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccines that received FDA approval earlier this year. In all, three in five older adults said they are very or somewhat interested in getting vaccinated against RSV. Interest in the vaccines was higher among people with chronic health conditions and those over age 70. However, nearly half of older adults reported not knowing about the new RSV vaccines, including 41% of those who said their health was fair or poor. These poll results signify a need for public health officials, primary care providers, pharmacies, and others to increase RSV vaccine awareness-building efforts.
- CBS News chief medical correspondent Dr. Jon LaPook provided an [inside look at the White House Initiative to Eliminate Hepatitis C In the U.S.](#) The initiative is being led by Dr. Francis Collins, the Acting Science advisor to President Biden (and Former Director of the National Institutes of Health). In March, President Biden proposed spending \$11.3 billion dollars over the next five years to help eliminate hepatitis C.
- A [new study](#) by the Benefits Data Trust reinforces the power of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) to reduce health care costs. More specifically, the study found that one year of SNAP participation reduces health care costs by 16 percent and pharmacy costs by 21 percent.
- The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) recently released [Part 2 of its 2021 Annual Homelessness Assessment Report \(AHAR](#)

number of people experiencing sheltered homelessness over time. Part 2 provides data on older adults, finding that almost 10,000 more people over age 65 experienced sheltered homelessness in 2021 than in 2019. Justice in Aging has resources related to homelessness prevention for older adults available [here](#).

- TFAH is excited to share a [new brief on the challenges, opportunities, and model programs for age-friendly public health in rural communities](#).
