

2. Cross-validate Results


3. Quantitative & Qualitative Data

Democratizing Data


- All Knowledge has Value







Our best understanding

- In the absence of PERFECT data (it never existed...) we can still make hypotheses that lead to a better understanding
- What is the standard of proof?







The value of conversation

- 'Group process' is a valid way to collect data
 - Efficient
 - Specific
- Quantitative process cannot accomplish what 'group process' does
- In 'group process', participants are analytical tools




Community health conversations











From here to there


Quantitative

• Last year in NYS homelessness was up 78% in NYS and a record number of unhoused died

Qualitative

- Top regional issues are:
 - Governmental barriers such as access to an ID and designations of 'homeless'
 - Lack of access to immediate services





From here to there to there to

Quantitative

 1 in 3 older adults fall each year; less than half adults 65 and over (41.3%) with reduced physical or cognitive function engage in physical activity

Qualitative

- Top regional issues are:
 - Transportation
 - Home health aides
 - Social isolation
- Top regional opportunities are:
 - Senior transportation navigator
 - Pooled homecare, more day programs
 - 'Aging is ok' campaign
