Diabetes in New York State

- An estimated 1.58 million New York State adults report being diagnosed with diabetes (10.3%)
- The percentage of New York State adults who have diagnosed diabetes increased from 6.3% in 2000 to 10.3% in 2020

Diabetes in the United States

- 37.3 million Americans have diabetes
- Diabetes is the 7th leading cause of death in the United States
- The total estimated cost of diagnosed diabetes in 2017 is \$327 billion

Consider that while almost 30 million people in the U.S. have some form of diabetes, one in four don't even realize they're walking around with the disease.

National Diabetes Month is an annual event each November to boost awareness about the risk factors, symptoms, and types of diabetes. If you've been recently diagnosed with either Type 1 or Type 2, or if you are considered pre-diabetic, hear the stories, check out the latest research, and connect with others who can help you on your journey to live a healthier life.





8. An innovative approach to public health that applies traditional marketing principles and theories to science-based strategies for disease and injury prevention, health promotion, and health protection.

Non-Fellow Spotlight!

"My name is Matthew Marmor, and I am one of the site supervisors for Steuben County Public Health. My role in the health department has been coordinating the Emergency Preparedness program for the past five years. Before this, I had around 25 years of county emergency management and public safety experience.

Like so many county health departments, much of our emergency preparedness program was in response to COVID-19, and we had a considerable catchup to accomplish simultaneously with recovery from COVID-19. Steuben County Public Health has been part of the rollout of the New York State Public Health Corps (NYSPHC) Fellowship Program since the program was launched, and I have had the opportunity to supervise four incredible Fellows since our start with the program. Steuben County currently has six Fellows spread out across two work sites. Our Public Health Director, Darlene Smith, and the Steuben County Public Health Leadership Team have been very supportive of our emergency preparedness project needs and support for Fellow placement.

The work put in by the Fellows has allowed us to make forward progress on reviewing and updating many of our emergency plans, incorporating lessons learned during the COVID-19 response. Seeing each Fellow advancing in their career through the NYSPHC Fellowship program is exciting. I am grateful for the opportunity to be part of their progress and wish success to all in the program."
