NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the

District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and nation.

The New York State (NYS) Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a number of new reports based on 2021 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by NYS DOH.

NEW! **BRIEF REPORT: “[Cardiovascular Disease, New York State Adults, 2021](#)”, provides updated prevalence estimates of NYS adults who reported having had a heart attack, angina/Coronary Heart Disease (CHD), or stroke in the state.

CVD is the leading cause of death in NYS, accounting for 27 percent of all deaths statewide. Heart disease and stroke are major causes of disability. Lifestyle modifications and interventions could prevent as much as 80% of heart disease and stroke; these include [never starting to smoke or quitting](#), being [physically active](#), [eating well](#), including consuming less [sugar-sweetened beverages](#) and reducing

The New York State Prevention Agenda 2019-2024 focuses on creating clinical and community environments that support the prevention, early detection, and management of diabetes, especially for populations at greatest risk due to social determinants of health. Relevant goals include providing routine testing, reducing obesity, supporting evidence-based care in health care systems to prevent and manage diabetes, and increasing referrals to evidence-based community programs to support individuals with and at risk for developing diabetes.

NEW! **Updated BRIEF REPORT: [Sun Exposure and Sunburn, New York State Adults, 2021](#). The brief report provides data on the prevalence of skin cancer risk factors, sun exposure and sunburn, from the 2021 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS).

The report highlights important data to inform efforts aimed at reducing risk factors for skin cancer. Anyone, regardless of skin tone, can develop skin cancer. The NYS DOH promotes strategies outlined in the [NYS Comprehensive Cancer Control Plan](#) to support skin cancer prevention and funds the [Community Cancer Prevention in Action \(CPIA\) program](#) to encourage local adoption of these important strategies.

Sun protection policies, environmental interventions, laws that reduce UV exposure, provider education to look for skin changes in people of all skin tones and raising awareness among all New Yorkers about sun protection can support equal opportunities to prevent skin cancer and improve skin cancer outcomes.

CDC Vaccine Safety Monitoring Updates — CDC continues to get questions about [COVID-19 vaccine safety](#). To date, almost 700 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been given in the United States, and vaccine monitoring in multiple safety systems continues to show they are safe. Some common COVID-19 vaccine safety concerns are addressed below.

- **Safety Monitoring.** CDC's [vaccine safety monitoring systems](#) are designed to be sensitive. The detection and assessment of potential safety signals and the communication of safety information to the public show how the vaccine safety monitoring process is working successfully.
- **Myocarditis.** Myocarditis following COVID-19 vaccination is rare, and cases occurring after mRNA COVID-19 vaccination have generally been less severe than those occurring after COVID-19 infection. Cases of myocarditis have occurred most frequently in adolescent and young adult males within seven days after receiving the second dose of the primary series of mRNA COVID-19 vaccine, though cases have also been observed in females and after receipt of other doses. In one study, the risk of cardiac complications in males 12–17 years old was 1.8–5.6 times higher after getting SARS-CoV-2 infection than after receiving an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine. In another study evaluating cases of myocarditis at least 90 days following symptom onset after mRNA COVID-19 vaccination, most patients were judged by their healthcare provider as fully recovered ([Vaccine Safety Publications | Research | Vaccine Safety | CDC](#)).
- **Ischemic Stroke.** There is no clear, consistent evidence of a safety problem for ischemic stroke when bivalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines were given alone or with flu vaccines, or when flu vaccines are given alone. A statistical signal for ischemic stroke after Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccine was detected in CDC's [Vaccine Safety Datalink](#) monitoring system in persons 65 years and older during fall 2022. CDC presented information at the [February](#) and [April Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices](#) (ACIP) meetings, and efforts have been underway to evaluate the signal. At the October 25 meeting of the ACIP, CDC [presented its review of seven vaccine safety studies](#) examining a [potential connection](#) between ischemic stroke and receipt of bivalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccination, flu vaccination, or flu and COVID-19 vaccination on the same day. Most study results have not shown an

association between vaccination and ischemic stroke, and no clear pattern demonstrating increased risk has emerged.

Vaccine safety and transparent communication are top priorities for CDC. CDC will continue vigilant safety monitoring of COVID-19 vaccines and share information and recommendations based on best evidence available. Everyone ages 6 months and older should get an updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness from COVID-19. The benefits of COVID-19 vaccination continue to outweigh any known or potential risks.

Coadministration of flu, COVID-19, and RSV vaccines

For the first time, vaccines are available to help protect against severe illness caused by all three of the major fall and winter respiratory viruses—flu, COVID-19, and RSV. People may choose to get [flu, COVID-19, and RSV vaccines at the same visit](#) if they are eligible, making it easier to stay up to date with CDC-recommended vaccines, while others may prefer to get their recommended vaccines at separate visits. For those people, there is no need to wait a specific amount of time after receiving one vaccine to get the next one. Getting all three vaccines at the same visit can help protect people who are at higher risk of getting seriously sick from flu, COVID-19, or RSV or who may not be able to return to their provider.

Scientific studies during the last three years indicate that it is safe to get both a flu vaccine and a COVID-19 vaccine at the same visit. Additionally, coadministration of flu vaccines and the new RSV vaccines was found to be safe in [clinical trials](#). While there are no clinical trial data on getting all three vaccines at the same time, CDC is continuing to monitor the safety of RSV vaccines, as it does for all vaccines. Getting multiple vaccines at the same visit may increase the risk of some side effects from vaccination. When side effects do occur, they are typically mild to moderate, like arm pain, swelling, headache, and fatigue. These side effects are usually short-lived.

Whether people choose to get flu, COVID-19, and RSV vaccines at the same visit or at separate visits, **the most important thing is that they get all vaccines recommended to protect themselves against these and other potentially serious illnesses this fall and winter.**

New Wastewater Data Dashboard for COVID-19 — CDC has launched a new [data dashboard](#) that dramatically improves the usability of wastewater data from National Wastewater Surveillance System (NWSS). Users can now explore national, regional, and state trends of COVID-19 virus detected in wastewater in all 50 states, U.S. territories, and select tribal nations.

Why is this important? This is the first time CDC has shared wastewater COVID-19 virus data at the state, regional, and national levels. Site-level data for COVID-19 virus in wastewater continues to be available on [CDC's COVID Data Tracker](#).

What's next? Data for seasonal flu and RSV are coming soon! The National Wastewater Surveillance System (NWSS) will be continuing to update all publicly available wastewater data displays to make wastewater data easier to understand and use.

Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) — Notes from the Field: The National Wastewater Surveillance System’s Centers of Excellence Contributions to Public Health Action During the Respiratory Virus Season — Four U.S. Jurisdictions, 2022–23 — A [new report](#) from *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR)* discusses how CDC’s National Wastewater Surveillance System (NWSS) Centers for Excellence used wastewater data to guide public health action in response to the spread of multiple respiratory illnesses (COVID-19, flu, respiratory syncytial virus [RSV], and enterovirus) during the 2022-2023 respiratory virus season.

Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) — SARS-CoV-2 Epidemiology and COVID-19 mRNA Vaccine Effectiveness Among Infants and Children Aged 6 Months–4 Years — New Vaccine Surveillance Network, United States, July 2022–September 2023 — Data from the New Vaccine Surveillance Network, a prospective population-based surveillance system, were used to estimate vaccine effectiveness using a test-negative, case-control design and describe the epidemiology of SARS-CoV-2 in infants and children aged 6 months–4 years during July 1, 2022–September 30, 2023.

Among vaccine-eligible children aged <5 years hospitalized or seeking care in emergency departments for acute respiratory illness during July 2022–September 2023, 86% had not received any COVID-19 vaccine. Despite low vaccination coverage, only 5% of children received a positive SARS-CoV-2 test result. Receipt of ≥ 2 COVID-19 mRNA vaccine doses was 40% effective (95% CI = 8%–60%) in preventing emergency department visits and hospitalization. Update on SARS-CoV-2 Variant BA.2.86 Being Tracked by CDC — Since CDC’s [first post](#) on BA.2.86 in August 2023, the proportion of infections caused by BA.2.86 has slowly increased. In the [CDC Nowcast](#) posted Nov. 27, 2023, BA.2.86 is projected to account for 5-15% of currently circulating variants. At this time, BA.2.86 does not appear to be driving increases in infections or hospitalizations in the United States. Salmonella Outbreak Linked to Cantaloupes — A CDC food safety alert regarding an outbreak of *Salmonella* infections linked to cantaloupes has been updated.

What Long-Term Care Facilities and Hospitals Should Do

Adults 65 and older, children under 5 years, and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to get very sick from *Salmonella*. In this outbreak, 14 sick people resided in long-term care facilities and 7 children attended childcare centers before they got sick.

CDC advises facilities that care for people at higher risk to not serve cantaloupes that may be contaminated:

- Do not use any recalled whole or pre-cut cantaloupes.
- Do not serve any cantaloupe that was supplied pre-cut if you don’t know whether Malichita or Rudy brand cantaloupes were used.

Key Points:

- Since the last update on November 24, 2023, an additional 18 people infected with this outbreak strain of Salmonella have been reported from two additional states, resulting in a total case count of 117 people from 34 states.
- Interviews with sick people and laboratory findings continue to show that cantaloupes are making people sick.
 - As previously reported, Malichita and Rudy brand whole cantaloupes have been recalled. Many pre-cut cantaloupe products have also been recalled. New recalls include pre-cut cantaloupe products from [Kwik Trip](#), [Bix Produce](#), and [Kroger, Sprouts Farmers Market, and Trader Joe's](#).
 - CDC is advising people not to eat pre-cut cantaloupes if they don't know whether Malichita or Rudy brand whole cantaloupes were used.
- CDC is concerned about this outbreak because illnesses are severe with more than half hospitalized, and people in long-term care facilities have gotten sick.
 - Half of sick people in this outbreak are adults 65 years or older, and 14 people resided in long-term care facilities before they got sick.
