

Encouraging Cancer Screening Paid Time Off Policies at Schuyler County Worksites

Introduction

- Cancer is the #1 cause of death in Schuyler County
 - Average annual death: 182.9 per 100K ¹
 - \circ 36% higher than the NYS level (134.5 per 100K) 2
- Each cancer diagnosis costs a business \$1,601 in lost productivity annually.³
- Early detection of cancer plays a crucial role in improving treatment outcomes. ³
- When cancer screening paid time off (PTO) is not provided, employees are less likely to get screened.³
- In Schuyler County, employers' attitudes and policies towards cancer screening PTO were unknown.

Methods

To understand the current attitudes and policies held by employers in Schuyler County, Schuyler County Public Health:

- 1. Developed an employee cancer screening paid leave policy package, in line with current cancer screening guidance. This package included:
 - Employer letter with commitment survey
 - Worksite Wellness Toolkit
 - Southern Tier Cancer Services Program flyer
- 2. Mailed packages with pre-paid return envelopes to 75 local worksites (20% coverage); received a 26% response rate.⁴
- Sent email reminders or made phone calls to worksites that didn't respond to the mailing.
- 4. Engaged with employers who don't currently have cancer screening PTO policies but have shown interest in adopting one to offer support or guidance in their implementation process.

Results








79% of worksites offer extra PTO beyond sick/vacation. t

7 of 12 worksites without this policy show interest in it.


Worksite Size (N=19) Micro 1-4 employee(s) Small 5-9 employees Medium 10-99 employees

Four local worksites initiated the policy change from this project; three already fully adopted their new policy.



52 local employees have gained benefits from this policy change.

Conclusion

According to survey responses and follow-up communication with local businesses:

- Schuyler County worksites, especially smaller businesses, lack awareness and implementation of cancer screening PTO policies.
- Micro- and medium-sized businesses show notable interest in adopting such policies. However, economic challenges hinder micro- and small-sized businesses from adopting these policies despite their interest.
- There is a need for:
 - Expanded outreach to more local worksites.
 - Enhanced awareness among local employers.
 - Identified resources to help smaller businesses in overcoming barriers to policy implementation.
