# **Harm Reduction**

Harm reduction is a set of practical strategies and ideas aimed at reducing negative consequences associated with drug use. Harm Reduction is also a movement for social justice built on a belief in, and respect for, the rights of people who use drugs.



# Language Matters

INSTEAD OF THIS	SAY THIS
Addict / junkie / druggie	<ul> <li>Person with a (serious) substance use disorder</li> </ul>
Addicted to X —	<ul> <li>Person with a (serious) X use disorder</li> </ul>
Alcoholic	<ul> <li>Person with a (serious) alcohol use disorder</li> </ul>
Clean screen / clean test	<ul> <li>Testing negative for substances</li> </ul>
Dirty screen / dirty test	<ul> <li>Testing positive for substances; actively using</li> </ul>
Drug habit	<ul> <li>Substance use disorder; compulsive or regular substance use</li> </ul>
Drug / substance abuser	Person with a substance use disorder
Drug offender —	<ul> <li>Person arrested for drug violation</li> </ul>
Former / reformed addict or alcoholic —	Person in (long-term) recovery
Relapsed	→ Had a setback / resumed use
Stayed clean ————	→ Maintained recovery

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




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## What is a Syringe Exchange Program?

- Grew out of HIV/AIDS epidemic
- Friendly & non-judgmental space
- Opioid Overdose Prevention
- HIV/Hep C screenings
- Wound care
- Referrals to other services
- Participants of SEPs of more likely to attempt Substance Use Disorder Treatment than nonparticipants




## **NYS Syringe Exchange Utilization**






## **NYC Syringe Exchange Utilization**

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


