
NYSPHC Mentorship Program Overview





NYSPHC Mentorship Program

- Mentors serve as professional role models and technical advisors, facilitating peer learning and providing relevant mentoring, career planning and navigational support to Fellows, enhancing their experience within the local and statewide public health landscape and the NYSPHC Fellowship program.
- Mentors have been identified from a variety of organizations throughout NYS including:
 - New York State Department of Health
 - Local Health Departments
 - Community Based Organizations
 - Institutions of Higher Education





NYSPHC Mentorship Program, Continued

- The NYSPHC Fellowship Program will utilize a cohort style of mentoring, encouraging ongoing networking and collaboration with partners outside of their host organization.
- Each cohort will include 4-8 NYSPHC Fellows and be led by 1-2 Mentors for two-years.



Mentor Assignment Determination

- Fellows have been assigned a Mentor(s) whose experience, skillset and knowledge are similar to their current Fellowship project.
- Mentor(s) may or may not serve in the same regions of the Fellows they have been assigned to lead.





Fellow Cohort Determination

- Fellows have been assigned to a cohort with Fellows from their region and one additional region.
- See below for regional cohort pairings:
 - Region 1 & 2
 - Region 3 & 4
 - Region 5 & 8
 - Region 6 & 7
- Fellows in each cohort have similar Fellowship projects to encourage ongoing learning and collaboration





Role of the Mentor

- Lead or co-lead a cohort of 4-8 Fellows for to two years
- Lead one virtual meeting with assigned cohort on a quarterly basis, at minimum
- Send meeting invitations for quarterly meetings
- Communicate changes to meeting schedule with assigned cohort, if needed
- Meet with Fellows in assigned cohort individually, if requested
- Collaborate with other Mentor cohorts, as requested



Role of the Mentor, Continued

- Communicate with NYSPHC staff, as needed
- Participate in two NYSPHC Mentor Check In meetings per year led by the NYSPHC Team
- Complete NYSPHC Mentor surveys twice per year
- Participate in NYSPHC activities including Educational Series, quarterly Consortia, and the annual NYSPHC Summit, if available




Role of Fellows

- Attend scheduled Mentor cohort meetings.
- Actively participate in scheduled cohort meetings by engaging in conversations, participating in meeting activities and providing input for future discussions.
- Communicate directly with Mentor if unable to attend a scheduled cohort meeting



Role of Fellows, Continued

- Fellows are encouraged to meet with Mentors individually.
 However, Fellows must request an individual meeting with their Mentor directly.
- Fellows are encouraged to collaborate with other Fellows in their cohort.

- Utilize the NYSPHC Training and Resources website
- Discuss other NYSPHC professional development components
- Discuss current events in public health
- Invite guest speakers

- Serve as a source of information for other Fellows





Mentors & Fellows Should Both...

- Graciously give and accept feedback
- Actively participate in scheduled meetings
- Evaluate the learning partnership regularly
- Contact the NYSPHC Team if any questions arise
- Collaborate with your cohort including your Mentor(s) and the other Fellows

- Convey your individual desires, needs and expectations
- Get to know everyone in your cohort
- Be respectful
