ICYMI: July 12, 2024 - New York State Cancer Registry Dashboards

The New York State Cancer Registry is pleased to announce the release of our updated cancer statistics. The most recent year for which data on new cases and cancer deaths are available is 2021. For the first time, we have published our data using interactive dashboards, including cancer incidence, mortality, trends, stage at cancer diagnosis and prevalence information. The dashboards are organized according to the geography at which the statistics are available.

NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Alcohol Program recently published an [article](#) which found that more than half of U.S. teens (ages 12 to 17) report sometimes or often seeing or hearing alcohol advertisement while streaming videos, watching TV, going to the movies, or browsing the internet. The research also finds Hispanic adolescents have 60% greater odds of being exposed to alcohol ads compared to White adolescents, and teens' chances of seeing or hearing alcohol ads increase by 20% with each year of age between 12 and 17.

NEW! July 18, 2024 Be Ready! Tornadoes

Knowing what to do when you see a tornado, or when you hear a tornado warning, can help protect you and your loved ones. Although nothing can be done to prevent tornadoes, there are actions you can take to protect your health and safety.

Tornado Watch: Tornadoes are possible. Be alert to changing conditions.

Tornado Warning: A tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. Take shelter immediately.

Get Out: Don't stay in a mobile home during a tornado. Find a sturdy building or seek shelter outside.

Watch Out: Most fatalities and injuries are caused by flying debris.

Look Up: If you see any of these danger signs, take shelter immediately:

- a dark or green colored sky
- large, dark, low-lying clouds
- large hail
- loud roar similar to a freight train

Stay Tuned: Listen to local radio and TV stations for weather updates. Take shelter if a tornado warning is issued.

Be Cautious: Do not try to outrun a tornado. Find a sturdy building to take shelter or stop your car, put your head below the windows, and cover your head.

Take Shelter: The safest place is the interior part of a basement or an inside room, without windows, on the lowest floor.

ICYMI - July 5, 2024

ACIP Approves Vaccine Recommendations for Upcoming Respiratory Season — CDC's [Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices \(ACIP\)](#) voted to approve several [vaccine recommendations](#) for the 2024-2025 respiratory season during its June 26-28 meeting. CDC Director Mandy K. Cohen, MD, MPH, adopted the recommendations, making them official.

Regarding the [respiratory syncytial virus \(RSV\) vaccine](#) for older adults, CDC recommends everyone aged 75 years and older and adults aged 60-74 years who are at increased risk of severe RSV disease receive a one-time single dose of RSV vaccine.

For COVID-19, CDC recommends everyone aged 6 months and older receive the upcoming 2024-2025 formula [COVID-19 vaccine](#). The [interim clinical considerations for COVID-19 vaccines](#) will be updated soon.

Last, regarding the [influenza vaccine](#), CDC continues to recommend people aged 6 months and older who do not have contraindications receive an annual influenza vaccine. For solid organ transplant recipients aged 18-64 years who are on immunosuppressive medication regimens, CDC recommends high-dose inactivated (HD-IIV3) or adjuvanted inactivated (aIIV3) influenza vaccines.

The ACIP develops recommendations for U.S. immunizations, including ages when vaccines should be given, number of doses, time between doses, and precautions and contraindications. Summer Safety — Many of the 100 million Americans packing up for summer vacations this year will travel with grandparents or to grandparents' homes. With nearly three-quarters of older adults taking at least one medication daily, young children are at risk for unintentional medicine ingestion if medicines are left within their reach. Practicing safe medicine storage habits helps protect young children from a trip to the emergency room.

Share these medicine safety tips for traveling with kids and grandkids:

1. Keep all medicines out of sight and reach of children. Whether you are traveling with young children or hosting them, keep all medicines up and away and out of their sight and reach. Find a safe place to keep medicines like a high cabinet or high closet shelf, and if you're in a hotel room, consider using the hotel room safe for safe storage.
2. Keep medicines in child-resistant containers. It may be tempting to transfer medicines to smaller containers for travel, but it's important to remember that containers such as pill organizers and baggies often lack the child safety features designed to prevent access by young children.
3. Ask the host where you can safely store medicines when you are a guest in their home, to ensure they're up and away, out of sight and reach of young children.
4. Save the Poison Help number (800-222-1222) in your cell phone so you'll have it in case of an emergency. Each poison control center is staffed with doctors, pharmacists, and toxicologists who can answer your questions 24/7. Make sure you have this number handy!

NEW! August 1, 2024 Summary of FY25 Senate Appropriations Bill

On August 1, the Senate Labor Health and Human Services and Education (LHHS) Appropriations Committee released its version of the FY25 LHHS appropriation bill and marked up the legislation out of committee. The proposed funding levels included within the bill are subject to change as both chambers of Congress are expected to negotiate before and after the current fiscal year expires on September 30.

The committee did release the legislative text of the bill, and ASTHO's government affairs team will conduct a detailed analysis in the coming days. The Senate LHHS bill is a high watermark for funding compared to the House LHHS bill, and there are considerable differences between them that will require reconciliation and negotiation on both sides. The committee provided the following summary.

Outlook: Both the House and Senate are in recess and expected to return to Capitol Hill in early September. With limited legislative days before the expiration of FY24 funding, we remain hopeful that Congress will pass a continuing resolution to fund the federal government past September 30 and negotiations in earnest related to the FY25 LHHS appropriation bill will resume after the November elections.

ASTHO's Government Affairs team will continue to advocate for state and territorial public health departments, encouraging Congress to increase funding for state and territorial public health priorities. The **full committee summary** is available for review.

Excerpts from Committee Summary

Public Health

The bill contains an increase of \$173 million for CDC above FY24 enacted levels, including:

- \$365 million for public health infrastructure and capacity, an increase of \$15 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$195 million for data modernization, an increase of \$20 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$425 million for cancer prevention and control activities, an increase of \$15 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$20 million in new funding for wastewater surveillance.

The bill also includes a total of \$613 million for the Ending the HIV Epidemic Initiative, across multiple agencies.

Pandemic Preparedness and Biodefense

The bill contains \$3.83 billion for the Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response, an increase of \$200 million above the FY24 enacted level, including:

- \$1.07 billion for the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority, an increase of \$55 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$835 million for Project BioShield, an increase of \$10 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$1.1 billion for the Strategic National Stockpile, an increase of \$30 million above the FY24 enacted level.

Addressing Substance Use Disorders and Mental Health

The bill includes a combined increase of \$215 million for substance use and mental health programs at SAMHSA and HRSA. This includes:

- \$2 billion for the Substance Use Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Services Block Grant, an increase of \$40 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$1.6 billion for State Opioid Response grants, an increase of \$25 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$155 million for the Rural Communities Opioid Response Program, an increase of \$10 million above the FY4 enacted level.
- \$1 billion for the Mental Health Block Grant, an increase of \$35 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$20 million increase over FY24 for the 988 Suicide Prevention Lifeline
- \$400 million for Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics, an increase of \$15 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$30 million for Mental Health Crisis Response Grants, an increase of \$10 million above the FY24 enacted level.
- \$104 million for the National Child Traumatic Stress Initiative, an increase of \$5 million above the FY24 enacted level.

Women's Health

The bill provides level funding for Title X and the Teen Pregnancy Prevention program. Additionally, it increases investments in maternal health across CDC, HRSA, and NIH, adding \$34 million for programs that address maternal mental health, prevent pregnancy-related deaths, and support best practices to improve maternal health outcomes.

Essential Health Care Programs

The bill includes \$1.86 billion for Community Health Centers, \$1.4 billion for Health Professions Workforce Development, \$2.6 billion for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program, a \$21.3 million increase in rural health programs, and a \$10 million increase to promote cybersecurity efforts across HHS.

Enhancing Tobacco Control through Retailer Licensing Policies

States and municipalities are adopting tobacco retailer licensing (TRL) laws, requiring stores to obtain licenses to sell tobacco products. These laws reduce tobacco retailer density, particularly in marginalized or low socioeconomic communities, decrease youth initiation and usage rates, and limit the sale of tobacco products to underage individuals. NEW! Expert planning, consultation contributes to implementation of measures to lower risk of COVID-19, other diseases at 2024 Paris Olympic Games

As the [2024 Summer Olympic Games](#) get underway in Paris, the world's largest athletics event is facing COVID-19 concerns after [5 Australian women's water polo players tested positive](#). A Paris 2024 spokesperson stated that [several protocols are in place](#) to mitigate disease spread at the mass gathering, including mask-wearing for those who experience any respiratory symptoms. Additionally, the Olympic Village is equipped with hand sanitizer stations in residential areas and restaurants.

Many national teams also have their own safety protocols; the Australian team is treating COVID-19 similarly to other respiratory illnesses, isolating affected athletes and having teammates wear masks and adhere to social distancing measures. This approach differs significantly from the [stringent protocols of the 2020 Tokyo Games](#), which experts say showed how other major events could be organized safely.

French Health Minister Frederic Valletoux said that while there's been a small peak in COVID-19 cases, the [risk of a major COVID cluster in France remains low](#). Though the dense population in the Olympic Village presents an inherent risk for infectious disease spread, [precautions are being implemented](#) to prevent many different diseases. For example, mosquito traps are being used to lower the risk of mosquito-borne illnesses, including dengue. The Paris Olympics organizers [collaborate with WHO's dedicated mass gatherings team](#), which provides expert guidance and tools for health planning and promotion using a risk-based approach.

As numbers of US human, animal bird flu cases rise, experts call for more urgent, collaborative measures to bring outbreak under control, fend off potential pandemic

US federal and state authorities, as well as poultry and dairy farmers and others, continue to monitor an [ongoing and uncontained outbreak of H5N1 avian influenza](#). Since April 2024, there have been [10 human cases](#), with the [latest 2 cases involving poultry workers in Colorado](#). The US CDC maintains that the current [public health risk for the general public remains low](#), but the outbreak has led to significant animal infections in both domestic and wild species. So far, the virus has infected [171 dairy cow herds in 13 states](#) since March 2024 and [nearly 101 million birds in a total of 1,170 commercial and backyard flocks in 48 states](#) since February 2022.

Experts are increasingly concerned about the ongoing transmission of H5N1, particularly given the recent human cases and the virus's spread to mammals, both domestic and wild. While all the documented human infections are linked to direct exposure to infected poultry or cows, have been mild, and are associated with [no signs of human-to-human transmission](#), the virus is now passing between mammals.

Mammal-to-mammal transmission

A [study published this week in the journal Nature](#) documents multidirectional interspecies mammalian transmissions of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) H5N1 clade 2.3.4.4b virus, [between dairy cows in herds, as well as from cows to cats and a raccoon](#). Each additional case of mammal-to-mammal transmission potentially [increases the likelihood of another human pandemic](#). To do that, the virus would have to mutate in a way that enables it to effectively transmit from human to human and cause more severe symptoms. Though this is not a certainty, the virus is [highly unpredictable](#).

Role of milk

The *Nature* study also provides more evidence that milk plays a major role in spreading the virus, although does not serve as the only infectious vector. The findings underscore the importance of [not consuming raw, unpasteurized milk](#), which could contain H5N1 and could infect drinkers, whether human or other mammal. Some experts are worried that people who consume raw milk might be infected, and those [cases are going undetected](#). Raw milk poses other disease risks, as well. A recent salmonella outbreak linked to unpasteurized milk from a California farm [sickened more than 171 people](#) from September 2023 to March 2024.

Greater response efforts needed

Experts say [several critical steps](#) are needed to address the H5N1 outbreak, including increasing environmental and clinical surveillance of viral activity, sequencing of all viral variants to track mutations, and developing a preventive vaccine. The US HHS recently announced several moves to [increase production of and develop](#) H5N1 and pandemic flu vaccines. Additionally, the agency this week amended a 2013 emergency declaration under the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act that [broadens the scope of the original determination](#) under which the agency can facilitate certain medical countermeasures to [apply to all influenza A viruses with pandemic potential](#), including H5N1, not only the H7N9 strain of bird flu.

In related news, the UN Food and Agriculture Organization today called for [urgent regional efforts](#) to respond to an [“alarming” increase in bird flu](#) among humans and animals across the Asia-Pacific.

Center for Health Security publishes summary of meeting to discuss increasing reusable respirator availability, use before next pandemic

In April 2024, the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security gathered experts and practitioners from academia, healthcare, government, nongovernmental organizations, manufacturers, trade associations, and other private sector entities to discuss increasing the availability and usability of reusable respirators before the next pandemic. This week, the Center published the meeting summary, titled [The Major Role of Reusable Respirators in Increasing Respiratory Protection for Future Infectious Disease Emergencies: A Stakeholder Discussion](#).

The meeting report:

- Presents 17 actionable recommendations for federal agencies, healthcare, and other stakeholders.
- Emphasizes the importance of reusable respirators for both daily use and pandemic readiness.
- Highlights key insights from the discussion. Focus areas include stockpiling reusable respirators and clarifying the roles of different stockpiles; supporting innovation and design; addressing institutional challenges to routine use; implementing education and training; and creating demand signals for US manufacturers.

The meeting ended with a strong call to action for stakeholders to move away from cyclical discussions on the topic and make immediate and concrete steps toward greater reusable respirator use and stockpiling.

Rural LHDs can refer to this guide when building a climate and health program for the first time, or when scaling up their programs to increase their climate response and adaptation capacity. CDC has announced the establishment of the [Communications and Public Engagement Workgroup](#) (CPEW) to assist the Advisory Committee to the Director (ACD) in developing recommendations to CDC on agency-wide activities related to how to communicate directly and more effectively with the public, with a focus on reaching local communities with messages. The CPEW convenes a balanced group of subject matter experts in communications, public health science and practice, community engagement, and behavioral science/behavior change campaigns to work with the ACD, CDC, in their development of advice and recommendations to CDC regarding effective communication with the public. Rhea Farberman, TFAH's Director of Strategic Communications and Policy Research, will serve on the CPEW.

July 25, 2024

The American College of Sports Medicine® (ACSM) and the Elevance Health Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Elevance Health, released today this year's rankings and findings for America's 100 largest cities. The Fitness Index results — based on 33 evidence-based indicators — showed more Americans are walking and biking to work, park expenditures are up, and food security improved slightly. Conversely, residents in the 100 largest cities are not exercising enough to meet minimum ACSM standards, the number of people getting seven hours or more of sleep each night is down and there was a decrease in reports of excellent/very good health as well as an increase in residents reporting poor physical health and mental health. The top 10 fittest cities are Arlington, Virginia; Washington, D.C.; San Francisco, California; Madison, Wisconsin; Minneapolis, Minnesota; Denver, Colorado; Atlanta, Georgia; Irvine, California; and St. Paul, Minnesota. Full rankings and scores, a call-to-action report, a city comparison tool and other insights are accessible on the [Fitness Index website](#).

In a new article for *Health Affairs Forefront*, Joshua M. Sharfstein, M.D., and Nicole Lurie, M.D., call for [steady federal support for state and local public health departments](#), tied to clear expectations — a key recommendation of the Commonwealth Fund Commission on a National Public Health System. They also say local public health should have an elevated role in federal policymaking. “Our country needs a highly functioning public health system across all levels of government to stop the next pandemic — from the top down, and from the ground up.”

July 23, 2024 Pain in the Nation 2024: The Epidemics of Alcohol, Drug, and Suicide Deaths Data Show First Improvement in Combined Substance Misuse and Suicide Mortality Rate in Five Years, but Multidecade Trends Remain Alarming High

A decrease in the alcohol-induced mortality rate led to a slightly lower combined rate of all U.S. deaths due to alcohol, drugs, and suicide in 2022, but the long-term trend of such deaths is still alarmingly high, according to a report released today by Trust for America's Health.

The report, [Pain in the Nation 2024: the Epidemics of Alcohol, Drug, and Suicide Deaths](#), includes data showing that between 2002 and 2022, combined rate of deaths due to alcohol, drugs, and suicide have increased by 142 percent from 74,003 deaths in 2002 to 207,827 deaths in 2022. Rates

and trends for deaths due to substance misuse and suicide vary across population groups and states and regions of the country. CDC released the annual update to the [Disability and Health Data System \(DHDS\)](#), which provides quick and easy online access to state-level health data on adults with disabilities. The latest data from the 2022 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), which is compiled into the DHDS, reveal that more than 1 in 4—over 70 million—adults in the US reported having a disability in 2022. For the first time, the 2022 BRFSS collected data on respondent experiences with Long COVID symptoms as well as demographic data on residence in urban or rural areas.

July 16, 2024

The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine recently published [Aging, Functioning, and Rehabilitation: Proceedings of a Workshop](#). This resource highlights a hybrid workshop at the University of Lucerne in Switzerland to host a discussion focused on the World Health Organization's concept of functioning. Speakers paid particular focus to healthy aging and the future of rehabilitation as a health strategy. Experts emphasized that the need for rehabilitation is increasing due

to rapid population aging accompanied by a rise in physical and mental health conditions, limitations, and injuries.

The Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF) published the issue brief [Medicaid Efforts to Address Racial Health Disparities](#). The resource aims to provide greater insight into key ways in which Medicaid can be leveraged to help address racial health disparities, drawing primarily from [health coverage](#) data, the [2023 KFF Budget Survey](#), and analyses from the KFF [1115 waiver tracker](#). [Study: Alcohol & Drug Use Cause Significant Harms that Go Beyond the Individual](#)

New first-of-its-kind research from PHI's Alcohol Research Group and partners finds that more than a third of U.S. adults—or 113 million people—are harmed from someone else's drinking over their lifetime, while 46 million experience harms from someone else's drug use. Harms included traffic accidents, vandalism, physical harm, financial issues and family or marriage problems. The study, published in the *Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs*, revealed that those most at risk of experiencing these harms differed by gender, race and ethnicity, and marital status. Researchers also found differences by race and substance type. For example, Black respondents experienced fewer harms from secondhand alcohol or opioid use than their white counterparts but reported more from other's cannabis use. Black individuals are more likely to face legal repercussions from cannabis use and be randomly drug tested, which can result in financial harms and family difficulties that then affects the larger community, said study authors.
