NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

The New York State (NYS) Department of Health (DOH) is pleased to announce the release of a new report, [Healthy Behaviors among New York State Cancer Survivors](#). The report provides data on the prevalence of healthy behaviors among New York State cancer survivors between 2018 – 2021, based on the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS).

A cancer survivor is a person who has cancer or who has had it in the past. Cancer survivors are at a greater risk of developing the same cancer or a new, unrelated cancer than people who have never had cancer. National guidelines for healthy behaviors for cancer survivors recommend avoiding smoking, limiting alcohol consumption, increasing physical activity, and maintaining a healthy body weight to ease negative effects of treatment, reduce the risk of comorbidities, and lower cancer recurrence and death.

According to this report, among New York State cancer survivors:

- 90.3% report not drinking excessively,
- 88.8% report not currently smoking,
- 74.1% report eating fruits or vegetables daily,
- 67.7% report engaging in physical activity,
- 50.2% report not currently drinking, and
- 34.5% report maintaining a healthy weight.

Public health opportunities to support cancer survivors include:

- educating cancer survivors on healthy while being mindful of the socioeconomic and cultural factors that may impact a cancer survivor's ability to adopt healthy behaviors,
- ensuring access to support services such as nutrition counseling, smoking cessation programs, and support groups, and

- developing policies, systems, and environments that support healthy food choices, safe and accessible physical activity opportunities, and reduced availability and marketing of alcohol and tobacco products.

In recognition of **World Stroke Day**, the New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new report based on 2022 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by the New York State Department of Health.

The brief report, “[Cardiovascular Disease, New York State Adults, 2022](#)”, provides updated prevalence estimates of New York State adults who reported having had a heart attack, angina/coronary heart disease, or stroke in the state. According to the report:

- An estimated 1,298,000 adults (8.2%) in New York State reported they have had a heart attack, angina/coronary heart disease, or stroke.
- The proportion of adults reporting a heart attack, angina/coronary heart disease or stroke increases for each decade of life and is significantly higher for: adults aged 65 and older (19.4%); adults with Medicare coverage (18.5%); adults in households with annual income less than \$50,000 (11.9%); and men (9.7%).
- Cardiovascular disease prevalence is higher among adults who live in rural regions of New York (9.9%), adults with food insecurity (9.7%), and adults who could not afford to see a doctor in the past year (9.5%), and is significantly higher among adults with a lack of reliable transportation (15.9%), adults diagnosed with a depressive disorder (12.1%), and adults who completed high school (9.2%) or less than high school (12.6%).
- The prevalence of cardiovascular disease in New York State is over three times greater among adults diagnosed with diabetes (21.7%), adults who report having fair or poor health (20.4%), and adults living with disability (16.7%), and over four times greater among adults diagnosed with high blood pressure (17.6%) than among adults without those health conditions.

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in New York State, accounting for 29 percent of all deaths statewide. Heart disease and stroke are major causes of disability. Lifestyle modifications and interventions could prevent [as much as 80%](#) of heart disease and stroke; these include [never starting to smoke or quitting](#), reducing [weight](#) to a normal level, being [physically active](#), [eating well](#), including consuming less [sugar-sweetened beverages](#) and reducing [excessive alcohol consumption](#), and being checked and treated for [high blood pressure \(HBP\)](#), [elevated cholesterol](#) and [diabetes](#).

Conversely, older adults participated at lower rates than other eligible individuals in FY 22.
