The PA dashboard is an interactive visual presentation of the most current tracking indicator data to track progress of the New York State's Health Improvement Plan at state, county and sub-county levels. It serves as a key source for monitoring progress that communities around the state have made regarding meeting the Prevention Agenda objectives. The most current data for New York State and the Prevention Agenda objectives are presented for approximately 100 tracking indicators and compared to data from previous time periods to assess the progress for each indicator.

The Community Health Indicator Reports (CHIRS) Dashboard application has been updated with the most recent and complete data and is now available on the NYSDOH website: <https://www.health.ny.gov/CHIRSDashboard>. The dashboard, which interactively displays data for over 350 indicators at state and county levels, is designed to be a key resource for Community Health Needs Assessment, County Health Improvement Plan, and Community Service Plan.

NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

NEW! February 25, 2025 The New York State (NYS) Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of an updated report based on the data from the 2023 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System. The report, “New Link” provides information on two patterns of excessive alcohol use: binge and heavy drinking among NYS adults. Binge drinking is defined as consuming 4 or more drinks for women and 5 or more drinks for men on a single occasion. Heavy drinking is defined as consuming 8 or more drinks per week for women and 15 or more drinks per week for men. Excessive alcohol use is a leading cause of preventable death and is associated with acute and chronic health problems including an increased risk for developing chronic conditions such as several cancers, high blood pressure and stroke.

Key findings from the report include:

- Nearly 1 in 6 adults in NYS (16.2%) reported excessive alcohol use in the form of either binge or heavy drinking in 2023, a significant reduction from the previous year (18.4%).
- An estimated 14.4% percent of NYS adults reported binge drinking and 5.6% reported heavy drinking in the survey period.
- Binge drinking was significantly higher in males, adults who were less than 35 years of age, and adults with an annual household income of \$75,000 or more.
- The prevalence of both binge and heavy drinking were significantly higher in adults who reported frequent mental distress (20.4% and 7.4%, respectively).

The [New York State Alcohol Surveillance and Epidemiology Program](#) works to reduce excessive alcohol use and its related harms by conducting public health surveillance, developing partnerships, and building support for population-based policy and environmental changes to reduce excessive alcohol use.

NEW! February 14, 2025 In recognition of American Heart Month, the New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of two updated Brief reports based on 2023 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System, an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by New York State Department of Health.

The report, “[High Blood Pressure, New York State Adults, 2023](#)”, presents data and information on New York State adults diagnosed with high blood pressure as well as diagnosed adults who take medication to manage their blood pressure.

- An estimated 5 million adult New Yorkers (32.1%) report being told by a health professional they have high blood pressure. Among that group, more than three out of four (77.0%) are taking prescription medicine to control their high blood pressure.

- High blood pressure is more prevalent among Black, non-Hispanic adults (39.3%) and White, non-Hispanic adults (32.7%) when compared to Hispanic adults (27.9%) and Asian, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, non-Hispanic adults (25.4%).
- Medication use for high blood pressure is highest among adults 65 years or older (93.2%), adults with diabetes (91.2%), those with Medicare coverage (90.8%), and adults with disability and females both at 81.8%.

The report “[High Cholesterol, New York State Adults, 2023](#)” presents data and information on New York State adults diagnosed with high cholesterol as well as adults had their cholesterol checked within the past five years.

- Over 5.2 million adults in New York State report being told by a health professional they have high cholesterol levels (38.5%).
- High cholesterol is more prevalent among adults with diabetes (66.2%), adults with high blood pressure (57.6%), adults living with a disability (49.2%), and adults with obesity (44.7%).
- Adults with less education, adults with lower household income, and adults without insurance coverage reported lower rates of having their cholesterol checked within the past five years (82.8%, 87.5%, and 62.8%).

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in New York State. High blood pressure and high cholesterol are two of the leading preventable risk factors for cardiovascular disease. Lifestyle modifications and interventions, including never starting to smoke or quitting smoking, increasing physical activity, eating well, consuming less sugar-sweetened beverages, reducing excessive alcohol consumption, and being checked and treated for high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol, and diabetes could prevent as much as 80% of cardiovascular disease.

ICYMI: January 10, 2025 The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new Information for Action report, “[Most Adults with Diabetes Have Never Taken a Course or Class on Diabetes Self-Management](#).” The report uses 2022 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data, an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by the New York State Department of Health.

Participating in a DSMES program can help people with diabetes prevent or delay serious complications like heart disease, kidney disease, amputations, and vision loss. 02/06/2025 11:15 AM - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is issuing this Health Alert Network (HAN) Health Advisory about a recently confirmed outbreak of Ebola disease in Uganda caused by the Sudan virus (species *Orthoebolavirus sudanense*) and to summarize CDC's recommendations for U.S. public health departments and clinicians about case identification, testing, and biosafety considerations in clinical laboratories.

Currently, **no suspected, probable, or confirmed Ebola cases related to this outbreak have been reported in the United States, or outside of Uganda.** However, as a precaution and because there are other viral hemorrhagic fever (VHF) outbreaks in East Africa, CDC is sharing best practices for public health departments, public health and clinical laboratories, and healthcare workers in the United States to raise awareness about this outbreak.

On February 5, 2025, CDC issued a [Travel Health Notice Level 2: Practice Enhanced Precautions](#) for people traveling to Uganda. Currently, CDC has not issued any interim recommendations to health departments for post-arrival risk assessment and management of travelers, including U.S.-based healthcare workers, arriving from Uganda. CDC recommends that travelers monitor themselves for symptoms of Sudan virus disease (SVD) while in the outbreak area and for 21 days after leaving. Travelers should also self-isolate and contact local health authorities or a clinician if they develop symptoms (early “dry” symptoms may include fever, aches, pains, and fatigue and later “wet” symptoms may include diarrhea, vomiting, and unexplained bleeding).

[Health Alert Network \(HAN\) No. 520 – Accelerated Subtyping of Influenza A in Hospitalized Patients](#)

01/16/2025 10:00 AM – The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is issuing this Health Alert Network (HAN) Health Advisory to clinicians and laboratories due to sporadic human infections with avian influenza A(H5N1) viruses amid high levels of seasonal influenza activity. CDC is recommending a shortened timeline for subtyping all influenza A specimens among hospitalized patients and increasing efforts at clinical laboratories to identify non-seasonal influenza. Clinicians and laboratorians are reminded to test for influenza in patients with suspected influenza and, going forward, to now expedite the subtyping of influenza A-positive specimens from hospitalized patients, particularly those in an intensive care unit (ICU). This approach can help prevent delays in identifying human infections with avian influenza A(H5N1) viruses, supporting optimal patient care and timely infection control and case investigation.
