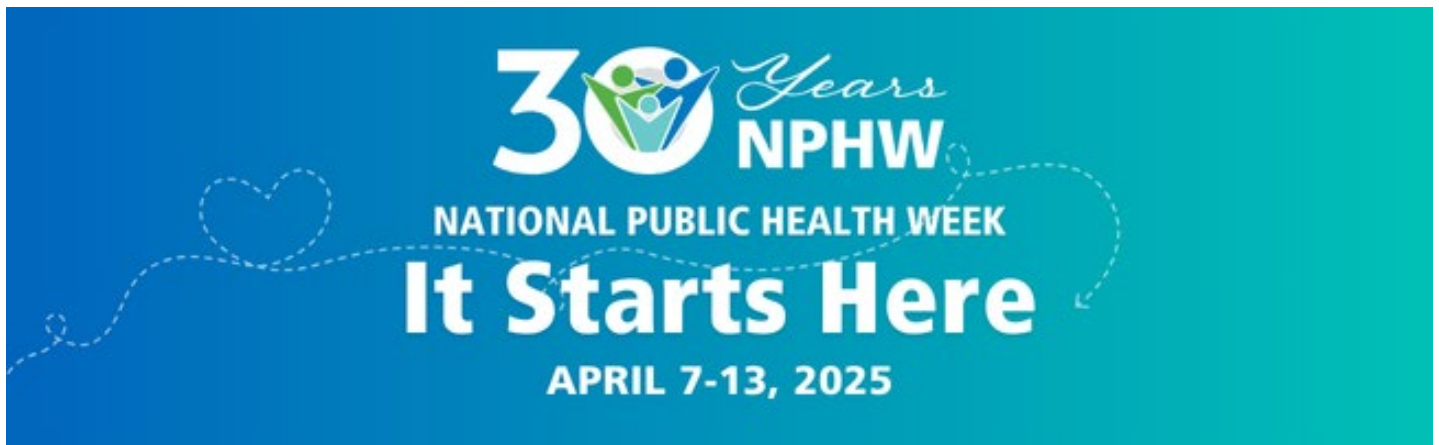

NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

ICYMI: February 25, 2025 The New York State (NYS) Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of an updated report based on the data from the 2023 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System. The report, “New Link” provides information on two patterns of excessive alcohol use: binge and heavy drinking among NYS adults. Binge drinking is defined as consuming 4 or more drinks for women and 5 or more drinks for men on a single occasion. Heavy drinking is defined as consuming 8 or more drinks per week for women and 15 or more drinks per week for men. Excessive alcohol use is a leading cause of preventable death and is associated with acute and chronic health problems including an increased risk for developing chronic conditions such as several cancers, high blood pressure and stroke.

ICYMI: February 14, 2025 In recognition of American Heart Month, the New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of two updated Brief reports based on 2023 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System, an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by New York State Department of Health.

The report, “[High Blood Pressure, New York State Adults, 2023](#)”, presents data and information on New York State adults diagnosed with high blood pressure as well as diagnosed adults who take medication to manage their blood pressure.

The report “[High Cholesterol, New York State Adults, 2023](#)” presents data and information on New York State adults diagnosed with high cholesterol as well as adults had their cholesterol checked within the past five years.

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in New York State. High blood pressure and high cholesterol are two of the leading preventable risk factors for cardiovascular disease. Lifestyle modifications and interventions, including never starting to smoke or quitting smoking, increasing physical activity, eating well, consuming less sugar-sweetened beverages, reducing excessive alcohol consumption, and being checked and treated for high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol, and diabetes could prevent as much as 80% of cardiovascular disease.

TFAH This annual report assesses state preparedness for health emergencies based on ten key indicators and tiers states and the District of Columbia into three performance categories: high, middle, and low. This year's report placed 21 states and DC in the high-performance tier, 16 in the middle performance tier, and 13 in the low performance tier. New to the report is an avoidable mortality indicator that measures deaths that could be prevented through effective public health measures or averted with timely healthcare interventions. Applicable data and policy

recommendations are also included to aid policymakers and health officials in improving the nation's emergency preparedness.

Key Findings

- 41 states now belong to the nurse licensure compact, an increase from the previous year. The compact allows nurses to work in any member state with a single multistate license.
- Most states have achieved accreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) and/or the Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) or both.
- In a majority of states, 95 percent of households or higher get their water from a municipal water system that did not have any water safety violations.
- Avoidable mortality is highly variable across states, reflecting differences in healthcare access, public health infrastructure, and underlying social and economic factors.
- 14 states reduced public health funding this fiscal year, three more than the previous year. Stable funding is of increasing importance as states are facing reductions in federal health and emergency preparedness funding.
- Too few people are vaccinated against seasonal flu. During the 2023-2024 flu season, only 47 percent of the population was vaccinated against the flu, down from last year and well short of the 70 percent goal established by *Healthy People 2030*.

Recommendations for Policy Action

- **Stable, Flexible, and Sufficient Funding:** Increase predictable, long-term investments in public health infrastructure and workforce.
- **Effective Leadership:** Strengthen evidence-based decision-making and coordination.
- **Outbreak Prevention:** Enhance immunization programs and address antimicrobial resistance.
- **Community Resilience:** Build healthy and resilient communities to strengthen preparedness.
- **Medical Countermeasures:** Accelerate vaccine and therapeutic development and distribution.
- **Healthcare Readiness:** Enhance emergency response capacity and healthcare system resilience.
- **Environmental Health:** Strengthen response capabilities to environmental threats and extreme weather.
