NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

NEW! June 27, 2025 - The New York State (NYS) Department of Health (DOH) is pleased to announce the release of a new report based on data from the 2023 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by NYS DOH.

The report, “[Cannabis Use, New York State Adults, 2023](#)”, presents data on prevalence of cannabis consumption as well as modes and reasons of cannabis consumption among NYS adults (18+ years).

Key findings from the report include:

- 14.7% of adults report consuming cannabis in the past 30 days.
- Just over half of the adults who consume cannabis, or 8 % of all adults, consume it less than 20 days per month, while an estimated 6.7% of adults consume cannabis daily or near daily (20 or more days per month).
- The most common mode of cannabis consumption by NYS adults aged 18 years and older is smoking (61.9%), followed by edible consumption (18.1%), and vaporizing (16.5%).
- Among cannabis consumers, just over half (54.5%) do so for non-medical reasons only, 30.5% for medical and non-medical reasons, and the remaining 15% consume for medical reasons only.
- Both non-daily cannabis consumption and daily or near daily cannabis consumption are significantly higher among individuals who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer/questioning and/or intersex; those who experience frequent mental distress; and those who currently smoke cigarettes, use e-cigarettes, or engage in binge or heavy drinking.

June 5, 2025 - The New York State (NYS) Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new Information for Action based on the data from the New York State Liquor Authority. The [report](#), provides information on the distribution of the different types of alcohol outlets in all the counties of New York State. On-premises outlets (e.g., restaurants/bars) sell alcohol to be consumed on site. Off-premises outlets (e.g., grocery/liquor stores) sell alcohol to be consumed off-site. Measuring alcohol outlet density can be a useful indicator for monitoring the availability of alcohol in communities and can be used to inform efforts in reducing excessive alcohol use and its associated harms.

The [New York State Alcohol Surveillance and Epidemiology Program](#) works to reduce excessive alcohol use and its related harms by conducting public health surveillance, developing partnerships, and building support for population-based policy and environmental changes to reduce excessive alcohol use.

ICYMI: May 12, 2025 - The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of two new reports based on data from the 2023 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System, an annual statewide telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and administered by the New York State Department of Health.

The [Reasons for Walking in New York State, Information for Action Report](#) finds that most New York State adults report having walked for 10 minutes or more at least once in the past week, with 8% walking only for transportation, 45% walking only for leisure, and 31% walking for both transportation and leisure. Whether people report walking daily depends on their reasons for walking. People who walk for both transportation and leisure are most likely to walk every day (38%), while 24% of people who only walk for transportation and 31% of people who only walk for leisure walk every day.

New York State is working to address the social determinants of health that impact physical activity, including implementing “Neighborhood and Built Environment” strategies and Complete Streets policies to increase opportunities for active transportation and physical activity and to create safe and accessible walkable communities.
