NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

NEW! March 26, 2026 – The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new report based on data from the 2022 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). The report, [Reactions to Race, New York State Adults, 2022](#), presents data on adults who experienced discrimination (i.e., reported that they were treated worse than people of other races) by demographics, risk factors and health behaviors.

Key findings from the report include:

1.) Compared to White adults, a significantly higher percentage of Black, Hispanic, Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander adults, as well as adults from all other racial groups combined (i.e., American Indian, Alaska Native, multi-racial, and other races) reported they:

- Thought about their race constantly or hourly
- Were treated worse than people of other races
- Experienced physical symptoms (i.e., headache, upset stomach, tense muscles, pounding heart) because of how they were treated based on their race

2.) Compared to White adults, a significantly higher percentage of Black and Hispanic adults, as well as adults from all other racial groups combined (i.e., American Indian, Alaska Native, multi-racial, and other races) indicated they:

- Were treated worse at work than people of other races
- Were treated worse when seeking healthcare than people of other races

3.) People who reported being treated worse than people of other races had significantly more days of poor mental and physical health, fewer hours of sleep, were more likely to be diagnosed with depression, and were more likely to currently smoke cigarettes.

New York State (NYS) must address the social problems, unfair practices and policies, and unjust conditions that stem from discrimination, as well as tailor health and social programs and services to the unique needs of individuals and communities to improve health equity in NYS.

NEW! March 4, 2026 - The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of the [Independent Evaluation Report of the New York Tobacco Control Program for 2023](#). The report provides a review of the Tobacco Control Program’s activities for calendar year 2022 and its progress in reducing tobacco use and related outcomes in New York State. This report and the companion [highlights report](#) were prepared by researchers at RTI International. Overall, the report demonstrates the continued impact of comprehensive tobacco control efforts statewide and reinforces the importance of maintaining and building upon this progress through sustained evidence-based tobacco control efforts.

The evaluation reflects progress in reducing cigarette smoking, strong reach of cessation and media efforts, expanding retail policy coverage, alongside persistent differences in tobacco use across population groups and ongoing concern regarding youth nicotine product use.

We encourage you to review the report and share its findings. The evaluation demonstrates measurable impact and supports continued progress in tobacco prevention and cessation across New York State.

NEW! March 2, 2026 - The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new StatShot based on data from the New York Adult Tobacco Survey, 2014-2024, entitled “[Recommendation to Health Care Providers: Ask, Advise, and Assist Patients to Quit Smoking](#)”.

The Clinical Practice Guidelines for Treating Tobacco Use and Dependence recommend that health care providers ASK if their patients smoke, ADVISE smokers to quit, and ASSIST patients with quit attempts through counseling and medications. In 2024, over 80% of adults who smoke reported seeing a health care provider in the past 12 months; among them:

- ASK: 89.9% were asked if they smoke cigarettes.
- ADVISE: 73.4% reported their health care provider advised them to quit smoking.
- ASSIST: 53.1% reported their health care provider offered assistance to quit.

Receiving assistance from a health care provider doubles the odds of quitting smoking. The aim of the Tobacco Control Program’s Health Systems for a Tobacco-Free NY initiative is to work with medical and mental health care organizations to implement systematic, guideline-concordant, evidenced-based tobacco dependence treatment into routine patient care. With more than 80% of NYS adults who smoke seeing a provider annually, strengthening the consistent delivery of evidence-based tobacco use treatment at every visit remains an important public health opportunity.

March 2, 2026 - The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of a new report based on data from the 2024 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System

(BRFSS). The report, “[Colorectal Cancer Screening, New York State Adults Aged 45 to 75](#)” presents data on colorectal cancer screening rates among eligible adults overall and by region, demographics, and other risk factors and health behaviors. This report is intended to highlight progress while also noting disparities.

Key findings from the report include:

- Overall, an estimated 73.5% of New Yorkers are meeting recommendations for colorectal cancer screening, falling short of New York State Cancer Consortium and National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable goals of 80.0%.
- Adults aged 45 to 54 years met recommendations for colorectal cancer screening less often (56.9%) than adults aged 55 to 64 years (78.8%) and adults aged 65 to 75 years (83.2%).
- Groups that least often met recommendations for colorectal cancer screening included those: without health insurance (36.8%), without a regular healthcare provider (35.1%), and who have not received a routine checkup in the past two years (30.9%).
- Adults who currently smoke cigarettes (62.9%), consume no fruit and no vegetables daily (67.8%), and report no leisure-time physical activity (68.4%) met recommendations for colorectal cancer screening less often than adults who did not report these colorectal cancer risk factors.

The New York State Department of Health is committed to removing barriers to colorectal cancer screening through its partnership with the [New York State Cancer Consortium](#), supporting implementation of evidence-based interventions to increase cancer screenings in health center settings, and providing community-based promotion, education, outreach, and cancer screenings to those without health insurance through the [New York State Cancer Services Program](#).
