Welcome to the Communication Strategies to Improve Colorectal Cancer Screening Rates Training

Communication Strategies to Improve Colorectal Cancer Screening Rates is a one-hour virtual training session focused on how to effectively communicate the importance of colorectal cancer (CRC) screening.

This training will show how to frame CRC screening messages to promote shared decision-making, with the goal of increasing CRC screening rates.

While geared toward primary care physicians, the training is valuable for all healthcare professionals, such as nurses, patient navigators, community health workers, and others who engage patients in conversations about screening.

The training has four key learning objectives:

1. Explain the impact of CRC on high-risk populations.
2. Identify key cognitive barriers to CRC screening.
3. Evaluate communication strategies.
4. Describe effective techniques to motivate patients to get screened.

NYSDOH - Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Reports

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is an annual telephone survey of adults developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention conducted in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and several US Territories. The New York BRFSS is administered by the New York State Department of Health to provide statewide and regional information on behaviors, risk factors, and use of preventive health services related to the leading causes of chronic and infectious diseases, disability, injury, and death. Data from the BRFSS are useful for planning, initiating, and supporting health promotion and disease prevention programs at the state and federal level, and monitoring progress toward achieving health objectives for the state and the nation.

April 17, 2026 – In recognition of Alcohol Awareness Month, the New York State (NYS) Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of the [Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System Brief on Binge and Heavy Drinking, New York State Adults, 2024](#). The report provides information on two patterns of excessive alcohol use: binge and heavy drinking among NYS adults. Binge drinking is defined as consuming 4 or more drinks for women and 5 or more drinks for men on a single occasion. Heavy drinking is defined as consuming 8 or more drinks per week for women and 15 or more drinks per week for men. Excessive alcohol use is a leading cause of preventable death and is associated with acute and chronic health problems including an increased risk for developing chronic conditions such as several cancers, high blood pressure and stroke.

Key findings from the report include:

- Nearly 1 in 6 adults in NYS (16.4%) reported excessive alcohol use in the form of either binge or heavy drinking).
- Binge drinking was reported by 15.2% and heavy drinking was reported by 5.1% of adults.
- The prevalence of binge drinking was significantly higher in males (19.0%) compared to females (11.5%), adults who were less than 35 years of age compared to older adults ages 45 and up, and adults with an annual household income of \$75,000 or more (20.0%) compared to those with lower incomes (16.4% or less).
- The prevalence of both binge and heavy drinking was significantly higher in adults who reported frequent mental distress (19.5% and 7.1%, respectively) than those who did not (14.6% and 4.8%, respectively), and adults who were covered by private health insurance (binge: 19.9% and heavy: 6.0%) compared with adults with Medicaid (binge: 12.% and heavy 3.8%) or Medicare 6.9%% and 3.8% respectively).

ICYMI: March 4, 2026 - The New York State Department of Health is pleased to announce the release of the [Independent Evaluation Report](#) of the New York Tobacco Control Program for 2023. The report provides a review of the Tobacco Control Program's activities for calendar year 2022 and its progress in reducing tobacco use and related outcomes in New York State. This report and the companion [highlights report](#) were prepared by researchers at RTI International. Overall, the report demonstrates the continued impact of comprehensive tobacco control efforts statewide and reinforces the importance of maintaining and building upon this progress through sustained evidence-based tobacco control efforts.

The evaluation reflects progress in reducing cigarette smoking, strong reach of cessation and media efforts, expanding retail policy coverage, alongside persistent differences in tobacco use across population groups and ongoing concern regarding youth nicotine product use. We encourage you to review the report and share its findings. The evaluation demonstrates measurable impact and supports continued progress in tobacco prevention and cessation across New York State.
